2nd Chance 4 Pets Participates at California Veterinary Medical Association's Pacific Veterinary Conference

Los Gatos, CA (July 15, 2008) – 2^{nd} Chance 4 Pets participated as an exhibitor at the California Veterinary Medical Association's (CVMA) Pacific Veterinary Conference, which was held June 26-29 in San Francisco. More than 1,100 veterinary professionals from across the U.S. and Canada attended the conference which featured 100 continuing education sessions over four days, plus a Vet Expo consisting of more than 350 exhibitors.

Representatives from two Bay Area animal care groups, the Latham Foundation (www.latham.org) and Romania Animal Rescue (www.romaniaanimalrescue.com), participated in staffing the 2nd Chance 4 Pets' booth. The volunteers distributed information to conference attendees about how to work with pet owner clients to plan for the lifetime care of their pets.

"We frequently participate in national veterinarian conferences in order to enlist veterinarians' help in communicating the importance of pet lifetime care to their clients," explained Shever, "Many veterinarians have been faced with the tragic situation of whether or not to end the life of a healthy pet simply because its owner didn't make arrangements for its continuous care."

According to Shever, veterinarians are key allies in the effort to educate pet owners about lifetime care for pets. "By working together, we can save pets that might otherwise be euthanized simply because pet owners didn't consider what would happen to their pets if their pets outlived them," Shever said.
