(March 5, 2015) — 2nd Chance 4 Pets Director Amy Shever has been invited to deliver a presentation on the importance of pets for the elderly at the Aging in America Conference to be held March 23-27, 2015 in Chicago. Shever, will be joined by Keith Greene, SPHR, Chief Membership Officer with Meals On Wheels Association of America; Dianne McGill, MS, Executive Director & CEO of Banfield Charitable Trust; and Rachel Duer, MA, Community Engagement Program Specialist, Texas Adult Protective Services.

The 90-minute workshop entitled "Aging in Community with Pets: Insights, Innovations, and Advance Planning" will highlight the crucial role that pets play in the lives of older adults. Senior pet owners experience less depression and have lower blood pressure than seniors who don't have pets. The panelists will describe successful programs that provide support to older pet owners. Attendees will learn about key issues to consider when working with clients who have pets, including innovative community-driven programs provide pet food distribution and low/no cost veterinary services, and how to help seniors make a plan for their pet's "lifetime care" if their pet should outlive them.
